What IS the Foundation for the Diocese of Helena?

Most people will be surprised to know, while the Diocese is in our name, the Foundation IS NOT part of the Diocese... but we work very closely with it. It is a not-for-profit 501(c) (3) entity that was created in 1978 to help build the future of our faith.

The Foundation's Mission

Our Mission is "to serve and strengthen the people, parishes, ministries, and apostolic mission of the Diocese of Helena."

We do this by working with parishioners, parishes, missions and ministries throughout our Diocese to build endowment funds that can help perpetuate our faith into the future for generations of Catholics to come.

Our FAITH IN ACTION Grants Program has given away more than \$1.1 million to parishes and ministries in our Diocese since 2007. In 2022 alone, we gave more than \$100,000 in grant money. (see article on page 8)

Our Board of Trustees is made up of hardworking representatives from every deanery in the Diocese (see Board list on this page) and has three staff dedicated to the amazing power of faith.

We provide donation options that help parishioners save taxes and plan their final legacy. We manage 164 endowments including one for every parish and mission and many family endowments designed to personalize their faithful giving.

Since 1978, the Foundation has distributed more than \$13 million from endowment earnings to parishes, missions and ministries. We provide a future for each of our parishes by working with the faithful to build their endowments so that one day, the quarterly distributions they receive from their fund will be large enough to support the parish and its ministries.

THIS is what the Foundation is. A forwardthinking ministry that strives to preserve our beautiful faith for your children's grandchildren and beyond. Together with your generosity, we are building and perpetuating our faith.

People of God,

I pray you are all well and experiencing a beautiful renewal of faith. Jesus has risen! But what does this mean for us...today...in the now of this moment? It starts with an encounter with who God is, and what Jesus has done intimately and personally for us through His passion.

God is a giver. All throughout scripture we can trace God's character as such. More than that, we can trace this reality through each moment of our lives. Acts 17:25 says "Rather it is He who gives to everyone life and breath and EVERYTHING." It makes sense, especially after walking with Christ through His passion, death, and resurrection. Priestly Formation and Parish Match Program—Results of 2022 programs

We love a good match! And given the success of the two match campaigns held in 2022, we feel confident saying our parishioners love them, too! No, we aren't talking about matches on dating apps, but rather the kind that allows us to raise money in praise and thanksgiving to our Savior. The kind of match that inspires generosity, through the love of Christ, in others.

In 2022, the Foundation offered a parish match and thanks to a generous family, an additional match for Priestly Formation. *Together those matches raised nearly \$148,401 for the hope and future of our faith!*

Parish Endowment Match

At the beginning of each calendar year, the Foundation runs a match campaign for parishes. You may recognize this from the ads we run in your church bulletin

Thanks to your generous hearts, the Foundation raised and granted over \$46,170 to parish endowments in this match campaign for the endowments of 68 of churches.

Priestly Formation Match

Later in the year, we were approached by a couple who offered a \$50,000 match for funds raised for the Priestly Formation and Development Endowment to honor their parents who had recently passed. Their matching gift was an invitation to give other hearts the opportunity to

expand in love through generosity and help support our priests and educate seminarians. It was so graciously received by so many that we surpassed the amount of this grant! *We didn't raise \$50,000 to get this match, we received \$57,085!* The donors of the match chose such a beautiful way to remember the faith their parents showed their entire lives.

Our thanks to all of you who gave. Every dollar counted. Every dollar mattered. When you say "yes" and share God's generosity, beautiful things happen. Thank you for your support. We are inspired and blessed by your generosity and we pray that the hand of God is reflected in everything we do at the Foundation.

She spent years as the sacristan at St. Jude's in Lincoln, deeply involved in parish life, and then Mass was suspended at the parish in 2022 due to the shortage of priests. "I saw it coming," Ida explained, "yet, when it happened it still came as a surprise."

This change has been emotional for so many of the faithful. "I was a sacristan and I saw the numbers going down. It's never as simple as it looks on the outside. Our priests have so much to do— more than people realize."

"For me personally, I had to ask, now what?" Ida and her husband Dan were deciding where they would attend Mass. They chose to make the drive to St. Theodore's in Avon each Sunday. She shares, "When we walked into St. Theo's that first Sunday, I met Seminarian Brett Rotz. I went home and watched a video online about Brett. In that video he talked about how he came to Carroll College and was first exposed to the idea of becoming a priest. He explained about his calling to the priesthood.

Father Bart (Tolleson) gave a homily around that same time at Mass in Avon, and he shared the story of his friend Fr. Stuart Long. Fr. Joe Fleming later explained to the congregation that Fr. Stu, who suffered from a disabling auto-immune disease that ultimately killed him, offered up his sufferings for vocations for the Diocese. Two weeks later at Mass, again in Avon, Ida met Seminarian Dillon Armstrong. "I wasn't looking for it, but these things kept coming to me," Ida explained.

A big reader, Ida began a book written by Kathleen Beckman: *Praying for Priests, an Urgent Call for the Salvation of Souls.* "Her book talks about the need for spiritual motherhood, and Mother Mary is the example of that for us. We need to pray for sanctification for priests." She also read Insinu Jesu, a book written by a Benedictine monk who encourages spending time in Adoration in reparation for and sanctification of priests. "These books spoke to me. They ask people to pray for our priests. It gave me a vision of what I needed to do."

"There are still a lot of people who are upset about the suspension of Mass at St. Jude's in Lincoln. You can't maintain the integrity of a parish without sharing the Eucharistic liturgy and sharing the Eurcharistic bread that unites many as One Body. But my dad said if you don't like something, get on your knees and pray about it. So I decided to do



two things: 1) Pray about it, and 2) Support the formation of new priests."

Ida has followed through on both of those commitments. She got a copy of the Seminarian poster from her church and spends time in prayer every day, praying for each of the seminarians by name as well as for future vocations to the priesthood. "In the book Praying for Priests, the author shares prayers we can say, and encourages praying the rosary. I would recommend doing that so we can all become Spiritual Mothers to these seminarians."

"I saw in the bulletin that the Foundation had a match to raise funds for Priestly Formation and Development." Ida, along with many others in our diocese, helped the Foundation reach the match goal for Priestly Formation. This \$50,000 match goal raised a total of \$107,500 in support of our seminarians and priests.

Our thanks to Ida Theis and the many Catholics who, like her, offer up their challenges in communion with Jesus, knowing "Thy will be done". God invites us to grow closer to Him through our sufferings, and if we let Him, as Ida did, the Lord transforms our sacrifices into something more beautiful and faith-affirming than we could ever imagine.

An Invitation to An Encounter With Christ

In between two sets of doors at Resurrection Parish on the MSU campus in Bozeman is access to the parish's new Adoration Chapel. A space where students and parishioners alike can go to spend time with Jesus; time to pray, time to discern, time to encounter Christ.

Adoration is beneficial to parishioners and students alike. "It is the one place outside of Mass where you see both the older parishioners and the students, the older and younger generations praying at the same time," explained Fr. Matt Christiaens, Parochial Vicar at Resurrection Parish. "Adoration awakens something in you, it draws you to it. There are so many people who receive their discernment through Eucharistic Adoration. Adoration is a helpful aid to make sure we are listening to Christ."

In June of 2022, Resurrection Parish applied to The Foundation for the Diocese of Helena Grant Program for a \$5,000 grant to purchase an exposition tabernacle. With a focus on evangelization, the Foundation's Outreach Committee (who oversees the Faith in Action Grants Program), was delighted to award this gift to the Bozeman parish.

"Hopefully the increase in adoration time will have a ripple effect. It is in line with the Eucharistic Revival and calling people back to an encounter with Christ in the Eucharist. It solidifies us to a relationship with Christ and knowing that it changes the way we as Catholics live," shared Fr. Matt.



In 2022, the Foundation awarded more than \$100,000 in grants to parishes and ministries within our Diocese. This was a record-breaking year! The first time since the Grants Program was founded that we were able to give over \$100,000 in a single grant cycle.

The Foundation Grants Program began in 2007. It was the idea of our Board of

Trustees who wanted to do more for the Diocese. In those 15 years, the program has given more than \$1.1 million dollars in grants!

Grants have been given to every parish and mission in the Helena Diocese, along with ministries including Catholic Social Services, several diocesan schools, the Guatemala Mission and more. During Covid, the Foundation Board suspended the grant application process and gave an equal grant to every parish in the Diocese in an effort to support our faith during an unprecedented time of crisis.

These grants have been used for everything from training of staff to teach Religious Education, to an autoclave at the Guatemala Eye Clinic to help people see. The monies have helped parishes upgrade and repair their churches and social centers as well as provide new instruments to help sing praises to God.

In 2023, big positive changes came to the Grants Program with a name change and focus on evangelization. Our 2024 grants cycle opened the middle of March with the new name of "Faith in Action Grants" and rather than funding capital improvements, the focus of these grants is sharing the Good News of Christ our The new tabernacle was put in place on February 19, 2023. The regular Sunday evening Mass was held and then Fr. Joe Paddock and Fr. Matt Christiaens led a Eucharist procession from the altar to the Adoration Chapel. The beautiful bronze tabernacle contains a window in the front where the Eucharist is placed, ready for prayers and worship.

Currently the Adoration Chapel is open from noon on Tuesday through noon Wednesday. "The long-term goal is to build up to perpetual 24/7 adoration. We aren't there yet, but this will help the parish grow towards that. The next step is to extend it from Sunday evening through Wednesday and keep extending the hours until is available 24/7.

Processional with Bishop Austin Vetter around the campus on May 7th, starting and ending at the new Exposition Tabernacle. This is truly "Faith in Action" and a beautiful evangelization to the parishioners and students who use the Adoration Experience to grow their faith. This is the reason the Foundation's grants program is so important as it works to bring communities closer to Christ.

Savior! Our dream is to see transformative evangelization in parishes, communities and throughout our Diocese.

Historically, grants up to \$5,000 have been provided, but in this next grant cycle we are going to DREAM BIG, giving one grant worth up to \$15,000! One transformative DREAM BIG grant will be awarded to a grant application that actively and imaginatively seeks to build an endeavor that reaches outside the walls of a parish and into its community to bring the Good News and God's love to all people.

Leadership in Action

Funding for the Grants Program comes from current and past leaders. The Foundation Grant Program began in 2007 with a dream from the Board of Trustees to "do more" for our parishes and ministries.

They made this dream personal by providing the initial funding through individual donations for an Endowment that builds and supports the Grants Program. Trustees current and past continue with gifts made to the Trustee's Endowment annually.

These are foot soldiers for Christ who have advocated for our parishes and ministries; leaders who have made great things happen for the past 15 years in the name of our Lord with the earnings that fund the Faith in Action Grants program. A Ministry to Give Hope and a Future

For I know the plans I have for you," declares the LORD, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future." — Jeremiah 29:11

This piece of scripture just seems to sum up the work of the Foundation for the Diocese of Helena. Our Mission is "to serve and strengthen the people, parishes, ministries and apostolic mission of the Diocese of Helena." We do that by raising funds not just to pay for a project or a seminarian's education, we raise funds that will last into perpetuity so our parishes and ministries will be able to bless your children's grandchildren and beyond.

We do this through endowments. Every parish and ministry in the Helena Diocese has an endowment at the Foundation. When you make a gift to the Foundation for the benefit of a specific parish (for example), that donation goes to the named parish's endowment. The principal of our endowment funds is never touched. Quarterly distributions are made to every endowment fund with a principal balance of at least \$5,000 (by July 1 each year). These quarterly distributions are used by the parishes and ministries to supplement their annual budget, pay for special projects or help fund evangelization efforts within their communities.

Here is an example of the impact a gift of \$10,000 has towards an endowed fund. Over 25 years, it will distribute \$13,110.95! It's as if God gives us the opportunity to be part of the future of faith, long after we leave this world. A gift to an endowment allows us to continue contributing to our faith, our parishes, even decades after we have left this earthly realm!



Your gifts to endowments help fund the hope and future of our faith. A complete list of endowments is available at FDOH.org or you can create a named endowment that benefits specific Catholic ministries. You can give online (fdoh.org), donate stock, write a check, or give through your IRA or an annuity. Recurring monthly giving opportunities are available online. 
