offices across the parking lot, as the space is more conducive to the retail-style layout of the Baby Boutique. This space allows families to "shop" for the items they need, providing a sense of respect and dignity that they normally would not have the opportunity to experience when receiving this type of charitable service.

The successes of the Baby Boutique are also its largest challenges. As the space and program grow to serve more families in need, it continues to place a heavier strain on the resources available for families, which is why the grant received from the Foundation for the Diocese of Helena has been vital to the operation of the ministry. For the fiscal year, the Baby Boutique is on pace to distribute more than 50,000 diapers. That's a lot of diapers! That number represents a 56% growth year-over-year, following 146% growth from the previous year. While a number of these families consistently return to use the ministry, there are new families coming to the Baby Boutique every session. Additionally, staff and volunteers at the Baby Boutique distribute only 2 dozen diapers per child at a time. While the Baby Boutique does receive donations from individuals and parishes throughout the year, it would be difficult for the ministry to keep up without

the generosity of the Foundation for the Diocese of Helena.
